1 REQUIREMENTS

- 1.1 A suitable person or organization with at least 10 years experience in conducting auctions.
- 1.2 The Auctioneer is responsible for timeously advertising the sale to afford possible interested clients, who may be resident elsewhere, the opportunity to attend sales.
- 1.3 The minimum requirements for advertising which must appear at least 14 days prior to any auction, both **statutory and marketing** are as follows:

- 1.3.1 **Redundant plant and equipment as well as other sundry items**

- 1.3.1.1 The advertisements are to be placed in the following Newspaper:

- The Courier**

- The Advertisement to appear at least 2 weeks prior to the date of the auction.

- Other media can be discussed.

2. AUTHORITY

- 2.1 A draft of the advertisements indicating proposed costs must be forwarded to Council's representative for perusal and acceptance prior to it being sent to the papers for placement.
- 2.2 Any deviations must be authorized by the Council Official
- 2.3 Only the actual cost of advertisements placed in the media will be refunded on production of documentary proof/invoice. Any discounts allowed to be credited to Council.

- 2.4 Any expenditure incurred in the printing of handbills, posters, catalogues etc., is to be met by the auctioneer.

3 PUBLIC VIEWING

- 3.1 Goods offered for sale must be available for inspection/viewing by the public at the appointed site, one hour before auction.

4 PRE-AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

4.1 EQUIPMENT

- 4.1.1 The Auctioneer shall supply **all** his own equipment (i.e. computers, printers, loud speaker/recording system and any other material or items that may be required).

4.2 LABOUR

- 4.2.1 The Auctioneer to supply the necessary labour for the preparation of the sale.

4.3 COLLECTION

- 4.3.1 It will be the Auctioneer's responsibility for the collection and transportation of all plant and equipment available for auction to the Auction Yard in Arbeidstreet, Industrial Area, BEAUFORT WEST.

4.4 PREPARATION - TIME FACTORS

- 4.4.1.1 This will be discussed once the service provider has been appointed.

5. PREPARATION

- 5.1 The Auctioneer is responsible for verifying that the Plant and equipment particulars are correct prior to compiling the Auction Catalogue (i.e. model, description etc.)
- 5.2 Arrange setting out the sales yard prior to viewing day and the sale
- 5.3 Remove/delete all identification marks from plant and equipment where applicable.
- 5.4 Mark Lots and prepare catalogues of items, which must be available on viewing day.
- 5.5 In the event of inclement weather the Auctioneer is to make available tarpaulins to cover any assets that are out in the open.

6. PRIOR TO THE AUCTION

- 6.1 The Auctioneer shall submit a pre Auction Bank guaranteed cheque/deposit as specified in Settlement of accounts paragraph 8.2.
- 6.2 The Auctioneer shall inspect all goods before auction in order to ensure that lot numbers and descriptions are correct.
- 6.3 The Auctioneer shall be at the auction site at least one hour before commencement of the auction.
 - 6.3.1.1 In the event of the Auctioneer requiring a refundable deposit in respect of a specific lot/lots, this must be announced prior to commencement of the auction.
- 6.4 Prior to commencement of an auction, the auctioneer is to announce the Conditions of Sale (to be cleared by the Council Official) .
- 6.5 All prospective buyers shall be registered by the Auctioneer on payment of a registration fee which amount will be decided by the Auctioneer.

7 DURING THE AUCTION

- 7.1 Auctioneers are expected to conduct all auction sales.
- 7.2 The Auctioneer can be assisted, by his own staff, during the auction.

- 7.3 The Auctioneer shall only close a bid from a registered buyer.
- 7.4 A Council official will separately record the individual amounts realized for each lot so that the amounts may be compared with the record kept by the Auctioneer on completion of the sale.
- 7.5 The Auctioneer may, use his discretion with regard to the grouping together of lots, depending on the type of commodities.

8 AFTER THE AUCTION

- 8.1 It is the Auctioneer's responsibility to obtain payment from the buyer/purchasers for all items/goods sold at an auction.
- 8.2 All monies received at the auction shall be recorded in a receipt book/system. The original and a copy to be furnished to the buyer.
- 8.3 The registration fee may be deducted from the amount payable by the buyer.
- 8.4 In the event of no purchases being made the registration fee shall, at the Auctioneer's discretion, be refunded to the buyer by the Auctioneer at any time during or after the auction.
- 8.5 All goods/items sold and paid for to be removed, where possible, by the buyer immediately after the auction.
- 8.6 It is the Auctioneers responsibility to ensure that any goods removed from the auction yard/s are in accordance with the purchaser's invoice/s.
- 8.7 The Auctioneer to ensure that his personnel are also available during the period of removal of goods/items purchased from the auction yard.
- 8.8 Any goods paid for and not removed, to be removed by the Auctioneer to his premises unless the buyer has made appropriate prior arrangements.
- 8.9 Upon finalisation of the auction, the Auctioneer, at his cost, to provide inter-alia:

9. GENERAL

- 9.1 The contract with the Auctioneer will be cancelled with immediate effect should it be proven to the satisfaction of Council that the Auctioneer is part, party to or allows a "RING"/Syndicate to operate at the Council Auction.
- 9.2 The risk in respect of goods sold passes to the buyer as soon as his/her bid has been accepted and the goods knocked down to him/her. The seller then accepts no liability whatsoever in respect thereof.
- 9.3 Council reserves the right, in special cases, to depart from the abovementioned procedure by including special conditions in both advertisements and sales catalogue. i.e. where goods for whatever reason are to be auctioned off site.
- 9.4 Nothing contained herein shall be construed as affecting the right of Council to sell any goods out of hand or by tender as may be deemed fit. (Before any auction)
- 9.5 Council reserves the right to cancel an auction sale at any time should this be deemed necessary. The advertising costs incurred by the auctioneer will be reimbursed on production of documentary proof, except where the auction is stopped as a result of any wrongful action by the Auctioneer.

PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM IN TERMS OF THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS 2011

This preference form must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a claim form for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status Level of Contribution

NB: BEFORE COMPLETING THIS FORM, BIDDERS MUST STUDY THE GENERAL CONDITIONS, DEFINITIONS AND DIRECTIVES APPLICABLE IN RESPECT OF B-BBEE, AS PRESCRIBED IN THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, 2011.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

1.2 The value of this bid is estimated to exceed/not exceed R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.

1.3 Preference points for this bid shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.

1.3.1 The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

1.3.1.2 B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION	20
Total points for Price and B-BBEE must not exceed	100

1.4 Failure on the part of a bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.

1.5 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

2. DEFINITIONS

2.1 **“all applicable taxes”** includes value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;

2.2 **“B-BBEE”** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

2.3 **“B-BBEE status level of contributor”** means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic

Empowerment Act;

- 2.4 **“bid”** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 **“Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act”** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6 **“comparative price”** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 **“consortium or joint venture”** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 **“contract”** means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9 **“EME”** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less .
- 2.10 **“Firm price”** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **“functionality”** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 **“non-firm prices”** means all prices other than “firm” prices;
- 2.13 **“person”** includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 **“sub-contract”** means the primary contractor’s assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16 **“total revenue”** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 **“trust”** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 **“trustee”** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

$$P_s = 80 \left(1 - \frac{P_t - P_{\min}}{P_{\min}} \right) \quad \text{or} \quad P_s = 90 \left(1 - \frac{P_t - P_{\min}}{P_{\min}} \right)$$

Where

- P_s = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration
- P_t = Comparative price of bid under consideration
- P_{\min} = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

5. Points awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution

- 5.1 In terms of Regulation 5 (2) and 6 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval

for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.

- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.

- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
