This quotation will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (No 5 of 2000) and for this purpose the MBD 6.1 and MBD 6.2 (**Local content**) form must be scrutinized, completed and submitted together with your quotation.
- 4. **NB:** No quotations will be considered from persons in the service of the state. The Declaration of Interest (MBD 4) form must be completed.

- 1. The RFQ is for a period ending 30 June 2023.
- 2. Retreading will not be considered.
- 3. Bidders shall regularly supply the Fleet Controller with a notice of receipt, detailing tyre serial numbers of all tyres.
- 4. Prices shall be per (one) unit.
- 5. The following detail must be e-mailed by the successful bidder to charlton@pamun.gov.za on every purchase made:
 - (a) Registration number of vehicle
 - (b) Odometer reading
 - (c) Job done (new tyre, puncture, tube etc)
 - (d) Tyre details make, size, serial number
 - (e) Wheel position
- 6. Two different size tyres are not permitted on the same axle.
- 7. Tyres of different types (eg cross-ply or radial-ply) are also not permitted on the same axle.
- 8. Written notification of price adjustments must be submitted before the 15th of the month for implementation on the 1st of the following month, supported by a letter from the manufacturer.
- 9. Any other requests for price adjustments must be well motivated and submitted to the Manager Community Services. The Municipality reserves the right to reject such request and if not accepted by the bidder, the Municipality may purchase the product from the alternative supplier and/or cancel the contract, with immediate effect.
- 10. The fitting of new tyres, wheel balancing, alignment, call-out and transport fees, will be awarded to every bidder that are awarded items on this RFQ since it would be impractical to split these services for a specific job, e.g. to have wheel balancing done by one supplier and take it to another for alignment.
- 11. All tyres either Locally Manufactured or Imported into South Africa must first be Homologated by the National Regulator for Compulsory Specification (NRCS) Automotive Division to ensure that specific tyre design and size meets to Standards as set out by the NRCS. All the Brands and sizes that have been approved/Homologated as well as the required Standards can be viewed on their web site-www.NRCS.org.za
- 12. This Standard applies to all Local Manufactures as well as import.

- 13. Bidders must have a fully equipped workshop facility and the workshop must comply with the Safety Standards and those standards from their Manufactures. Failure to submit proof will be considered as submitting a non-responsive bid.
- 14. Bidders must submit proof that they are agents of the specific brand (s) from their manufactures. Failure to submit proof will be considered as submitting a non-responsive bid.
